Research should be implemented directly into all clinical trials and therapies, so that current patients are monitored and followed, their survivorship path is part of the treatment plan, and they have access to information. But also, so that the knowledge gathered from their experience becomes part of what informs treatments for cancer as well as for survivorship in the future.
