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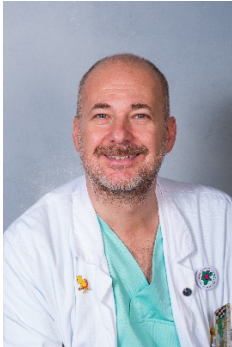
A challenging case of Rhabdomyosarcoma...

He has been working since 1994 at the Pediatric Oncology Unit of the Istituto Nazionale Tumori of Milan, where he is the person responsible of the Outpatient Service. He tackled research projects dedicated to soft tissue sarcomas, pediatric rare tumors and adolescents/young adults. He worked as chair and board member of various cooperative groups. In particular, he is currently chair of the EpSSG Scientific Committee on Non-rhabdomyosarcoma soft tissue sarcomas, co-coordinator and co-founder and of the Italian TREP project (Tumori Rari Età Pediatrica – Rare Tumors in Pediatric Age), chairman of the European Cooperative Study Group for Pediatric Rare Tumors ExPERT. In the last years, he devoted himself to the special needs of adolescents with cancer. He developed the “Youth Project” in his center. He currently chairs the Italian AIEOP Committee on Adolescents and the SIOP-Europe AYA Committee.

He is author or co-author of more than 400 papers published on international scientific journals
