My name is Vasiliki Ganosi and I am a paediatric Oncologist and that was my dream since I was in medical school. I was born and studied in Greece. I moved in the UK, after completion of my training in General paediatrics in Archbishop Makarios Hospital in Nicosia, Cyprus in 2017. I spent 6 months as a clinical fellow in general paediatrics in University College London Hospital and after that I have been working only in the field of paediatric Oncology and Haematology. I spent 12 months as a clinical fellow in paediatric Oncology/Haematology in Royal Marsden Hospital in London and since March 2019 I have been working as a Senior Clinical Fellow in paediatric Oncology/Haematology and BMT in Bristol Royal Hospital for Children. I have been appointed the post of Locum Consultant in Paediatric Oncology in Southampton University Hospital and that post starts in March 2022.

Andishe Attarbaschi is a professor and paediatric oncologist at the St. Anna Children's Hospital in Vienna, Austria. He is also highly involved in leukaemia and lymphoma research and is involved in several clinical trials as a study coordinator or principal investigator. Professor Attarbaschi is a member of the editorial boards for *Frontiers in Pediatrics – Pediatric Hematology* and *Hematological Malignancies and Pediatric Blood and Cancer* and has produced over 160 publications.
