


PART III: Call for an EU Childhood Cancer Advisory Board



An **EU Childhood Cancer Advisory Board** would:


- 1. Support the coordination of actions <u>across all</u> relevant EU initiatives
- 2. Foster a comprehensive inclusive approach
- 3. Avoid the risk of fragmentation
- 4. Accelerate the advancement towards the overall objective to cure more children, cure them better, and reduce inequalities





An **EU Childhood Cancer Advisory Board** would <u>also</u>:

- Connect stakeholders to achieve synergies for a 'childhood cancer in all policies' approach
- Advise on unmet needs
- Ensure continuity with existing European networks and collaborative groups
- Mobilise parent, patient & survivor organisations from the grassroot to European levels








